

FLAGSTONE PAVING SET ON DECOMPOSED GRANITE



MATERIALS

- * Decomposed Granite
- * Flagstone
- * Level
- * Tamper
- * Small Sledge Hammer
- * Safety Goggles

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Dig out native soil so that depth of decomposed granite plus height of flagstone will be flush with top of edging / existing paving.
- 2. Level out native soil and tamp down for a firm base.
- 3. Spread 1" of decomposed granite on top of native soil, tamp down.
- 4. Spread another 1" layer of decomposed granite and tamp down.
- 5. Check thickness of stone and add more decomposed granite if necessary, tamp down.

 Note: Top of flagstone should be flush with existing sidewalks.
- 6. Place stones and wiggle into decomposed granite so they are embedded. Try to maintain uniform joint spacing of about 1".
- 7. Larger flagstone pieces are easily broken by tapping with a small sledgehammer. Note: The larger the piece of flagstone the more stable the paving area. Do not break if not necessary.
- 8. Back fill joints with decomposed granite.
